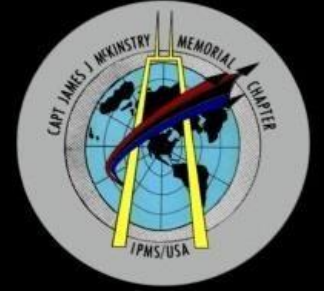

Kit has been enhanced using a Yahu instrument panel, Ultracast seat, and Obscureco wheels. Ignition wires were added to the engine. Model is painted with Tamiya, Alclad, MRP and Model Master colors. Markings are from AMDG and Thundercal decals. Model is weathered with artist oil paints and pastel chalks. Major Thorne was Group Operations Officer from March to August 1944.

Kit has been enhanced with a Quinta cockpit set, Quickboost ejection seat, KA Models resin exhaust nozzle, Master Models pitot, AOA, & static dischargers, and Eduard resin wheels. Model is painted with MRP paints and weathered with artist oils. Markings are from Two Bobs decals. Diana (MM 7236) was painted to celebrate 5° Wing before disbandment in October 2010 – she only carried the markings from April 16 to August 31, 2010.

Revell, McDonnell-Douglas F-15E Strike Eagle, 1/48

Kit has been enhanced with a Quinta cockpit set, Quickboost ejection seats, Aires resin exhaust nozzles, Master Models AOA, Phase Hangar Resin pylons, G-Factor landing gear, and Royale Resin wheels. "Tank Plinking" load from Meng GBU-12s, Zoukei Mura Sidewinders, Kinetic AMRAAMs, and sensor pods from the kit. Model is painted with MRP paints and weathered with artist oils. Markings are from Two Bobs decals. Artwork was painted by Staff Sargent Jason Henton during Operation IRAQI FREEDOM.

A pilot's fateful, career-altering flight under Michigan's Mackinac Bridge

65 years ago, on **April 24, 1959**, an aviation stunt that defies belief took place in the Mackinaw Straits between the upper and lower peninsulas of Michigan. Legend has it that a U.S. Air Force RB47E Stratojet reconnaissance aircraft piloted by Strategic Air Command Captain John Stanley Lappo, flew underneath the Mackinac Bridge where Lake Michigan and Lake Huron converge. The Mackinac Bridge, also known as the "Mighty Mac," is an impressive suspension bridge connecting Michigan's Upper and Lower Peninsulas. The highest point between the water surface in the Mackinaw Strait and the bottom of the bridge is approximately **155 feet** at the center. The tail of the RB-47E stands at **27 feet, 11 inches** off the ground. If we do the math, that leaves about **127 feet** of space between the water and the bottom of the bridge to maneuver. Considering the RB-47E's stall speed in these conditions (which may have been as slow as 150-190MPH), the plane would cover that distance in just over a second or two. According to reports, Capt. Lappo was reported to higher authorities after the bridge fly-under. He was allegedly charged with violating a regulation prohibiting flying an aircraft below **500 feet**. The story goes that Capt. Lappo was permanently removed from flight status by the Commanding General of the Eight Air Force, Lieutenant General Walter Campbell.

Whether fact or fiction, the daring feat of flying a nuclear-capable bomber under the Mighty Mac remains an intriguing piece of aviation history. It's a reminder of the audacity and skill of those who push the boundaries of what's possible in the skies above us.
