Boultron Paul Defiant, 1/48 Airfix

Jim included some Eduard Photo-Etch details, used only in the cockpit. Mr. Surfacer black primer was used. The paints used were AMMO RAF WW2 Early Colors by Mig; for colors other than camouflage Tamiya paints were used. The assembly was a good fit with no major problems encountered. It was an enjoyable subject to build and that looked interesting.

Packard Phaeton by Hubley, 1/22

This kit of the Packard Phaeton was produced by Hubley and was generally produced between 1960 & 1975. He used a primer purchased at a local auto parts store and painted it with Tamiya Racing Green. Super glue was used to cement the dissimilar plastic and metal parts together. This was a work in progress.

Atlantis Kit of White 3000 Gas Tanker.

I drove the box truck version of this truck while I was in college.



Duncan Sharp**Bristol Blenheim Airfix Kit 1/72**

It was originally proposed as a small passenger carrying aircraft and the RAF realized that it might be used as a light bomber. It struggled in its role at the beginning of the war as it was slow and vulnerable. It was constantly upgraded, and the Blenheim 4 was a better aircraft. The platform was used as a basis for the Beaufort and from that came the Beaufighter. All colors used were Vallejo model air. I used an oil and spirits wash for the panel lines and then sealed with Vallejo Ultra Matt. I then used Tamiya weathering products and finished with some chalk dust. I then picked out some spots using a silver pencil and highlighted some other panels using a 2b pencil.

Hasegawa H8k "Emily" 1/48

The kit itself was a fairly easy build. There were however some areas where I had a little trouble getting parts to fit such as the pilot canopy glass fitting over the cockpit itself. In cases like this I simply used some "Mr. Surfacer" to fill in the small gaps, I waited for the filler to dry. From there I sanded off the excess material and the problem was solved. I painted the aircraft with Tamiya silver and let it dry. I then used Tamiya IJN Green to spray over the silver. To get the effect that I wanted, I simply took some popsicle sticks to rub on the aircraft. This was a raised panel line aircraft so the paint on the raised rivets came off, leaving the silver paint underneath to be exposed. The overall effect was what I wanted, so I stuck with it. The decals that came with the kit went on fairly easily after I gloss coated the aircraft using Future Floor wax in my airbrush. The decals that went on the fuselage did not go on easily and I ended up tearing up both decals trying to position them. Fortunately, I had a fellow club member (David Kopielski), make me some new ones. The new decals worked great.

Tamiya 1/48 MiG 15bis

I used Tamiya LP-11 Silver Lacquer. Aeromaster Decals sheet 48-230 Korean War MiG Aces Part 2. The plane was flown by Russian Captain Pavel Milauszkin, with 10 victories in 1952.

Tamiya 1/48 F4U-1D Corsair

Paint used was Gloss Sea Blue mixed with Tamyia paint. The decals were from Fundekals 48016 whistling Death. Flown by Marine Captain H.J. Valentine, squadron VMF-312 Kadena Airfield, Okinawa 1952.

Tamiya 1/48 F3F-2

Paints used were Gunze Sangyo Yellow for the wings, Orange for the wings and Alclad Aluminum for the fuselage. Yellow-wings decals were used.
